ORDER

In exercise of the powers conferred by Central Government vide Notification No. 1520(E) dated 20th October, 2005 of the Ministry of Labour and Employment the undersigned hereby revise the rates of Variable Dearness Allowance for the workers employed in **Agriculture** w.e.f. 01.10.2016 on the basis of the average Consumer Price Index for agricultural labourers reaching 852 from 841.33 as on 30.06.2016 (Base 1982=100) and thereby resulting in an increase of 10.67 points.
